SAINT POSTER

Catholics choose an additional name at Confirmation. The preferred name is your baptismal name, because it expresses the close relationship between the sacraments of Baptism and Confirmation, but you may choose a different one.

If you choose a new name, please choose a name of a recognized saint of the Catholic Church. If your baptismal name is not one of the recognized saints, a new name should be chosen for Confirmation.

Saints are chosen to serve as patrons and models for us to look up to. Students, you should choose a saint's name, not because you like the name or the sound of it, but because you admire the Christian life that the saint led. In choosing this name, you are saying this person is a role model for how you want to live as you mature in your faith.

Knowing about your saint is important. This project will help you explore the life of the person you have chosen as a Christian role model.

You will need one standard-sized sheet of poster board (22 x 28 in.).

The following criteria **must** be incorporated into the poster. How your present the information is entirely up to you. BE CREATIVE!

*What role did this person play in the Catholic Church?

*What aspects of this saint's life or personality attracted you?

*How is this saint a model for Christians today?

CANDIDATE/SPONSOR SERVICE PROJECT AND REFLECTION

ST. VIVIAN PARISH

The Confirmation program at St. Vivian requires each candidate to participate in a service project WITH their Sponsor, or (if they are not available) another adult. The service is your choice, decided upon between student and adult, has no set time requirement, and may be done at your convenience. During this time of COVID restrictions, service may take any form, including doing work for an organization or charity from home.

Candidates are encouraged to reach beyond their comfort zones, and to tap into the gifts and talents that are given to them by God to help others in need. Options include helping an elderly person with a large errand or repair, helping at a parish function, or working with a local social service organization. The candidates are also required to write a reflection of the service performed and how it affected their faith formation.
